Personnel Absent: Village Clerk/Treasurer Kufel (Medical), Trustee LouAnn St. Germain (Excused), and Village Engineer Amy Franco.

RESOLUTION # 109-23

APPROVAL OF BOARD MEETING MINUTES-APRIL 27TH, 2023

Dep. Mayor Gustafson made a motion to approve the minutes (Facebook Livestreamed) from the April 27th, 2023, Board Meeting. The motion was seconded by Trustee Strong. The motion was approved: Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

RESOLUTION # 110-23

GENERAL FUND ABSTRACT APPROVAL

Trustee Wilmer made a motion to approve General Fund Abstract #25 in the amount of \$205,573.67 covering voucher #1634 thru #1695. The motion was seconded by Trustee Strong. The motion was approved: Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

UPDATE ON 115 CHESTNUT ST.-CLOSING MAY 31, 2023

The Mayor stated the next item on the agenda is Update on 115 Chestnut St.-Closing May 31, 2023:



House next to Fire Dept., we have been told the closing will be on or before May 31, 2023, so that was the last communication we had from Atty's. working on that; so, hope everything is going well.

UPDATE: 118 GROVE STREET

The Mayor stated the next item on the agenda is Update: 118 Grove Street: He drove by yesterday and sees no activity, but he thinks it was extended, another chance was given, but if there is no action. He continued we just cannot let this thing sit there for months on end. Discussion took place back and forth re: Structural Damage to 1st flr. and basement, the Codes Enf. Officer explained we are working with an architect on revised plans and a renovation plan by a design professional to review and to make sure that all the documentation is compliant and in place. Expecting the plans to review before the next mtg., then they move on to issuing the permit, as the owner is eager to get working on this. Currently the house has had a placard put on it.

NEW BUSINESS:

RESOLUTION # 112-23

DISCUSS/APPROVE ASCAP LICENSE FEE

Dep. Mayor Gustafson made a motion to Approve the ASCAP License authorizing the Mayor to sign for the Summer Concert Series valid for 9/1/22-8/31/23 in the amount \$420. The motion was seconded by Trustee Strong. The motion was approved: Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

RESOLUTION # 113-23 DISCUSS/APPROVE COMMUNITY CTR RFP'S OUT FOR BID WITH BID DATE OF JUNE 2ND, 2023-BASEMENT RFP

The Mayor stated the next item on the agenda: Discuss/Approve Community Ctr. RFP's Out for Bid with Bid Date of June 2nd,2023: There are 3 RFPs for the Comm. Ctr. for your review and approval: 1) Basement \$50,000 through Community Development), 2) Pavilion, and 3) Main Entrance; \$125,000 is shared between Pavilion and Main Entrance project and there is a little updated plan. He continued the Basement project is ready, so we can send out the RFP quickly. He added the Pavilion and Main Entrance are waiting for numbers to NYS sends to us, then when we get feedback from DASNY. He added he would like to approve them conditionally, so we get official designation, the money is available; we could start the process, the bid date is 6/4/23. Trustee Wilmer clarified that is just for the Basement, right. The Mayor stated yes, this 1 is just the Basement. Trustee Strong made a motion to discuss to send out an RFP for the Basement Renovation for \$50,000 from Comm. Development. The motion was seconded by Trustee Wilmer. Discussion went back and forth re: Sump pump, backup pump is not included, although some thought that 2nd back up pump should be included. It was explained one of



the RFPs included drainage, solving drainage along here and help the Basement as well. It was agreed it could be put in; the plan is a little generic with not a lot of detail. The motion was approved: Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

RESOLUTION # 114-23 DISCUSS/APPROVE COMMUNITY CTR RFP'S OUT FOR BID WITH BID DATE OF JUNE 2ND, 2023- PAVILION AND MAIN ENTRANCE

The Mayor stated both the Comm. Ctr. RFPs Out For Bid With Bid Date of June 2nd, 2023- Pavilion and Main Entrance: Together are \$125,000, the Pavilion originally was around \$80,000, for that work; and then they gave us more money. He continued so we had to come up with another something to do, so we are extending the entrance out here, and then we are going to do drainage; because there is no place to take the water off of this roof and around here. He added so we are going to extend, cut the paving out here, put in a pipe; and take it out to a dry well out back. He explained then we are going to put a gutter up, so that water will go away from the Basement, so that is going to help with that issue as well. He entertained a motion to, if you want to table it, we can, but he entertained a motion to approve the Pavilion and Main Entrance Improvements, it is 2 separate RFPs, but with the same amount; it is not 2 separate amounts of \$125,000. Trustee Wilmer made a motion for discussion. The motion was seconded by Trustee Strong. Discussion went back and forth re: Windows are poor, and wanted to putting money into windows, drainage great idea, but could be full submittal of windows and extension. After much discussion Trustee Wilmer amended his motion to approve the RFP for Pavilion to send in now, so they could get the approval back. He continued he wanted to look more into quotes for the windows, so the Main Entrance and drainage RFP was tabled until a later time. The motion was approved: Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

RESOLUTION # 115-23

DISCUSS/APPROVE SYRACUSE HAULERS CONTRACT EXTENSION TO MAY 31ST, 2024

The Mayor stated the next item on the agenda: Discuss/Approve Syracuse Haulers Contract Extension for the 5th yr. to May 31st, 2024, for previously agreed option renewal bid price of \$393,719.52. Trustee Strong made a motion for discussion to Approve Syracuse Haulers Contract Extension for the 5th yr. to May 31st, 2024, for previously agreed option renewal bid price of \$393,719.52. The motion was seconded by Dep. Mayor Gustafson. Trustee Strong clarified this was the last yr. for the extension. Atty. Germain stated yes, we can extend it this time, and will have to redo it next time. The motion was approved: Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

The Mayor stated the next item on the agenda: Approve New Member for Fire Department-Sir Winston.

Trustee Strong stated wonderful to see the VIg. has had a long-standing relationship, that partnership in the VIg. employee work roles, we have seen such a benefit from previous members that were in the DPW, not going on every call, but reported fires. He continued it is nice to see we can pick up with someone who works in the VIg., who may not actually live in the VIg. The motion was approved: Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

The motion was approved: Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

Dep. Mayor Gustafson made a motion to approve appointment of new Full-time Officer Chad Thompson at the bottom step for salary per contract of \$48,241 for discussion. The motion was seconded by



Trustee Wilmer. Discussion took place back and forth re: Salary, level of his training, and how much longer to complete. Start date will be based on successful completion of the background, and investigations. Dep. Mayor Gustafson thanked Trustee Strong for the email that he sent, it was very informative about Chad and the other possible employees. Trustee Strong stated good work by the entire committee. The motion was approved: Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

RESOLUTION # 122-23

DISCUSS/REVIEW/APPROVE THREE POTENTIAL PART-TIME POLICE OFFICERS

Dep. Mayor Gustafson made a motion to Approve Officer Myers, Officer Baker, Officer Bell for Parttime Officers start date will be based on successful completion of the background and investigations with entry level for pay starting at \$20/hr. The motion was seconded by Trustee Strong. The motion was approved: Strong, Wilmer, and Gustafson, all voting in favor of the same.

<u>CITIZENS' VOICE</u>: The Mayor invited anyone that would like to share concerns or thoughts via Facebook to address the Board.

Doug Hummel of 128 Herbert St. stated storage sheds standard size 10' x 10', wanted to know if code could include the 100 sq. ft without a permit req'd. Codes Enf. Officer Fry stated she will have to look at how it is worded, and discuss that with our Atty. She continued then she would be more than happy to respond to Mr. Hummel in writing.

Pat Fergerson of 215 S. Main St. reminded Festival is coming, she has opportunities to participate, this evening and will continue to offer this opportunity. She continued she appreciated the people who have donated many dollars and many events; the Festival is progressing. She added she is sure that Parks Dir. Burkinshaw will have more words for you on the mtg. on Monday evening if anybody wants to join us.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:

Police Department: (Police Chief William Becker): He stated the following:



- Month of April Totals: 610 Total Calls for service, 220 Property Checks, 12 Domestics, 14 Motor Vehicle Accidents, 40 Traffic Stops, 30 Traffic tickets, 17 Criminal Arrests
- So far for May: 245 Total Calls for service, 80 Property Checks, 9 Domestics, 6 Motor Vehicle Accidents, 33 Traffic Stops, 18 Traffic Tickets, 6 Criminal Arrests

Fire Department: (Fire Chief Richard Allen): He stated the following:

- Thank you for approving 2 new members tonight, both come with experience, so will have Fire Dept almost immediately there, they will have to get through some interior classes
- Burn Ban: Call Taft Rd: Towns population over 20,000, Illegal: Burning brush or leaves; especially for any VIg.
 - o Police Chief Becker: Not allowed to burn in Vlg., because of close proximity of houses
 - If charged during Burn Ban, becomes a misdemeanor
- Fire Chief: Exception: Cooking fires, have to have grate on it, 3' of parameters there; food present as well to justify it
- Call volume up last mo., 1 fully involved fire, 3 minor fires in last couple of wks.

Public Works Department: (DPW Sup't.: Ed Ware): He stated the following:

- Cleaning streets, just finished another wk. of brush
- Found bucket truck to rent, near Philadelphia, only 1 available, need to pick up; safe alternative for the guys out in the street
- Mayor Butterfield verified: Broken pot removed
 - DPW Sup't Ware stated yes, tomorrow new flowers will go in by Vet's Wall, hanging baskets will be in between 14th and 22nd.

Parks and Recreation Department: (Parks Director: Anthony Burkinshaw): He stated the following:

- Thank you for hiring the Staff and Lifeguards; it is nice to see the number of Lifeguards we have returning; we are very fortunate to have them many returning when there is a shortage
- 5/15/23: Festival/Friends Mtg.: Downstairs at 6:30 PM at Comm. Ctr., we are going to go over everything that is Festival related and make sure we have everything buttoned up for the 27th
- Saturday, 5/27/23: Festival starts at 11:00 AM-5:00 PM: We have live music, 20 cars shown interest in classic cars, bounce houses for kids, 6 different food trucks, over 40 different vendors

Codes Department: (Codes Enforcement Officer: Brandy Fry): She stated the following:

 Friendly Reminder: Courtesy Reminder: The Annual Burn Ban is on until May 14th, that is a Statewide Burn Ban



- Also, burning trash is illegal all yr., it is in the entire state of NYS; please keep in mind, she
 understands it is warm out, everybody is eager, wants to make sure everyone is following
 the compliance in NYS Law and Codes
- Understands not everyone is in favor of an answer or decision based on Compliance requirements and due process by the Codes Enf. Dept., yet our goal is truly bldg. and life safety which is fire safety and zoning regulations; these are already in place. She would encourage anyone to come and talk about such things at the mtgs. or come to the office; she would be more than happy to educate or advocate for whatever we can with in our capabilities, but our dept. is really aiming for safe and healthy businesses in the neighborhood
- Thank you to all the depts., she missed the last mtg., due to a wake; but thank you again, because everybody has been working really hard together to maintain and create that safe healthy environment

Clerk-Treasurer: (Village Clerk-Treasurer Kufel): No Report. Absent.
